1. Vote to adopt meeting notes from November meeting

Notes were unanimously adopted.

2. Student representative reports

Maggie Fiske visited from the band program and discussed the recent jazz night as well as the upcoming combined winter concert with the middle and high school bands on December 8. As part of the program, they will be doing "Jupiter" from Holst's *The Planets*, and the AP Music Theory class has prepared a visual reading guide for the Jupiter event. Julia Treese visited from the orchestra program and discussed the upcoming combined winter concert with the middle and high school orchestras on December 20. They will be presenting it at the concert. She also noted that 32 people were chosen for Senior Districts and 22 or those qualified to audition for All-State.
